Strength

The college has received permanent affiliation of Solapur University Solapur already. We received 2(f) and 12(B) status of UGC. The college has completed three cycles of Accreditation and re-Accreditation by NAAC and was awarded C++, B and B+ grade with CGPA of 2.35 for second cycle and 2.62 for third cycle. The college has polution free campus. There are more than 80% students from socially and economically weaker sections of the society. The college tries to provide various scholarships of Government to the students. The college has been offering skill developed and value added courses as like Spoken English, Tally, CMLT and Office Automation. Every year college takes the student feedback on teacher and curriculum. University has permitted Ph.D. Research Centre in Physics. A sufficient infrastructure is made available.

• Weaknesses

Academic year 2014-15 College got 12(B) status of UGC so there is problem of research funding. However, there is limited research progress and lack of funds for Minor and Major research project. Our faculty of Science, Commerce, B.C.A., B.Sc. (ECS) is going on non-aided facility. The college is affiliated to Solapur University, it has to follow the curriculum designed and developed by the University. We have adopted the CBCS pattern for First and second Year Classes for all streams and CGPA pattern for third year of all streams evaluation is concerned. The college Staff participates in paper setting, examiners, and maintenance of examination discipline.

Opportunities

It is the rural college, yet there are some opportunities for the further development. Especially Maharashtra State is having a great web of Co-Operative and Private Sectors. So there are many opportunities to our undergraduate students in these sectors. To avail these opportunities to our students, the experts from the Co-Operative and Private Sectors always communicate with our Principal as well as the placement cell of the college. The Principal and Placement Cell inform all this to the skilled and worthy students in the college. Many of the students of our college have been settled in their own business. The college has planned to start more skill based courses in traditional faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce as per new Central Government Policy. The introduction of Bi Vocational Courses as per new policy of UGC and Central Govt.




